

GEORGIA (4-0, 2-0 SEC) BULLDOGS

THE GAME: The No. 13/13 University of Alabama football team will travel to Athens for a matchup with the No. 8/6 Georgia Bulldogs at Sanford Stadium for the Crimson Tide's first true road contest of the 2015 season. The game is scheduled for a 2:39 p.m. CT kickoff on CBS with Verne Lundquist and Gary Danielson in the booth and Allie LaForce working the sidelines. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter. ESPN Radio will be calling the game nationally, with Bill Rosinski, David Norrie and Joe Schad on the call.

RANKINGS: Alabama enters week five ranked as the No. 13 overall team in both major polls. Georgia is ranked No. 8 in the Associated Press Poll and sixth in the Amway Coaches Poll.

**GEORGIA:** The Bulldogs welcome the Tide to Athens sitting on a 4-0 (2-0 SEC) record following last weekend's 48-6 win in Athens over Southern University. Georgia opened the season with a 51-14 victory at home over ULM before taking to the road for the Bulldogs' first conference game of the season, a win over Vanderbilt, 31-14, in Nashville. UGA then returned to Sanford Stadium to open its home conference slate, taking down South Carolina 52-20 on Sept. 19. The Bulldogs are led by head coach Mark Richt, who owns a 140-48 (.745) career mark in 15 seasons in Athens. Georgia returns 42 lettermen from a season ago, including 16 starters (seven on offense, six on defense and three on special teams).

SERIES HISTORY: Alabama and Georgia will meet for the 67th time in a series that dates back to 1895. The Crimson Tide leads the series, 37-25-4, and also owns the 14-10 advantage when the two teams meet in Athens. The last matchup on the UGA campus came in 2008, with the Tide earning a 41-30 victory over the Bulldogs. In the most recent meeting, UA claimed its 23rd Southeastern Conference championship with a 32-28 victory in 2012, securing the Tide's spot in the national championship game. Alabama would go on to defeat Notre Dame, 41-14, earning the program's 15th national championship.

SEC ROAD OPENERS UNDER SABAN: Nick Saban is 7-1 in road conference openers during his time with the Crimson Tide and has outscored his opponents, 294-153 (36.8-19.1 ppg) in his first eight seasons at Alabama.

**NEXT GAME:** Alabama will return home for a matchup with Arkansas at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide owns the all-time advantage in the series, 15-8-0, and is a perfect 8-0 during Nick Saban's tenure as head coach.

Office: 205-348-2088 e-mail: rwoodruff@ia.ua.edu **FACING OFF WITH THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide has the toughest schedule in college football this season, according to ESPN.com's College Football Power Index. SEC teams represent 13 of the 25 toughest schedules in college football, per that same index. Alabama faces off with 10 teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago, joining only three other teams in the nation to face the same gauntlet (also, Arkansas, Vanderbilt, Virginia). Only 14 teams nationally square off with at least nine opponents who went bowling in 2014.

**ALWAYS IN THE HUNT:** Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in only three regular season games without national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications for the Tide in the past eight years (83 of 86 games).

**TIDE SUCCESSFUL IN SEPTEMBER:** Alabama is 30-1 in September since 2008. Adding games in August, that record improves to 33-1. The Crimson Tide's only losses in September came on Sept. 19 against Ole Miss, and before that on September 20, 2007, to Florida State in Jacksonville by a score of 21-14.

**RETURNING SUCCESS:** The 2015 Crimson Tide returned 12 starters and 54 letterwinners from its 2014 squad that finished 12-2 as the SEC Western Division and SEC champions. The 2015 team returned seven starters on a veteran defense including Jonathan Allen, Denzel Devall, Eddie Jackson, Cyrus Jones, Reggie Ragland, Jarran Reed and A'Shawn Robinson. The offense welcomed back the staples of its offensive line in center Ryan Kelly and left tackle Cam Robinson.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: A pair of wideouts made their first career start against ULM, including senior Richard Mullaney and freshman Calvin Ridley. Prior to last weekend's non-conference game, quarterback Cooper Bateman made his first career start against Ole Miss. In the Middle Tennessee contest, Minkah Fitzpatrick (DB) and Dakota Ball (TE) each made their first career starts. In the season opener with Wisconsin, seven students made their first career start, including three on defense and four on offense. Getting their first career nod on defense were Marlon Humphrey (DB), Darren Lake (DT) and Shaun Dion Hamilton (LB). The offensive starters were made up of Jake Coker (QB), Robert Foster (WR), Dominick Jackson (OL) and Ross Pierschbacher (OT).

**BEATING THE BEST:** Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide is 32-12 (.727) against the Associated Press top 25, including an 18-6 (.750) mark against AP top-10 teams. This season, the Tide faces off against seven teams in the AP preseason poll, the most ranked opposition of any team in the nation. Alabama finished 5-2 in 2014 against opponents ranked in the AP top 25 after going 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 against the AP top 25 in 2010.

**ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008:** Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 87 games, the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013 and 12-2 in 2014. Boise State is second with 84 wins while Oregon is third with 82 victories.

**NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw seven former UA players selected in the 2015 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Amari Cooper who went fourth overall to the Oakland Raiders, the Tide's highest selection since Trent Richardson went third overall in 2012. Safety Landon Collins was the next to go (33rd, New York Giants) followed by T.J. Yeldon (36th, Jacksonville Jaguars) with both players being selected in the second round. Versatile back Jalston Fowler followed Yeldon, being selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the Tennessee Titans. Also going in the fourth round was offensive lineman Arie Kouandjio who went 112th overall to the Washington Redskins. The Tide's final pair of draft picks came in the seventh round, with offensive lineman Austin Shepherd going to the Minnesota Vikings at pick 228 and linebacker Xzavier Dickson going at pick 253 to the Super Bowl Champion New England Patriots.

**LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL:** Alabama has had more draft picks over the last five years (37) than any other college in the nation. Fourteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 19 have gone in the first two rounds of the NFL Draft. The list of 37 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

#### **OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES**

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama's success on the field over the past eight seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2015 squad features four players who already have degrees in hand before the opening kick of the Wisconsin game. Over the past eight seasons (2008-present) Alabama has seen **94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate)** by players still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after already having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive **11 players earn a master's degree** before stepping foot on the field.

**ACADEMIC PROWESS:** The Crimson Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the highlights of the Tide's academic successes under head coach Nick Saban.

- already earned a master's degree.
- For the second consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).
- Alabama's last three national title football teams included 60 players who
  had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That same team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the 2011 SEC Academic Honor Roll
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- Alabama has led the Southeastern Conference in number of football student-athletes being named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

**KELLY'S CLASSROOM SUCCESS:** Senior Ryan Kelly has been a staple on the Crimson Tide offensive line for each of his four seasons in Tuscaloosa, but just as impressive are his academic talents. The Tide center graduated last summer with his undergraduate degree in marketing and is currently enrolled in classes working towards his master's degree in the same specialization, which he is scheduled to receive this December. During his undergraduate career he was named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll three times, the SEC Freshman Honor Roll and the Dean's list in both semesters of 2013. Kelly currently holds a 3.75 grade point average in his graduate studies.

**CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY:** What Alabama football does off the field is equally as important as their successes on the field. Last season alone, the Crimson Tide put in 200-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals and on campus.

**RAGLAND PUTTING IN WORK:** Senior linebacker Reggie Ragland has dedicated himself to volunteering in the community each of his four seasons, contributing numerous service hours each season. Across his first three years in Tuscaloosa, Ragland put together an impressive list of volunteering opportunities and has gone above and beyond what is asked of Alabama football studentathletes. In all, he has totaled more than 50 hours of community service across double-digit volunteer opportunities that include visits to hospitals, schools and churches. Ragland has also visited veterans numerous times at local VA hospitals.

**SENIOR CLASS AWARD NOMINEE - REGGIE RAGLAND:** Reggie Ragland was selected as one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to student-athletes who excel both on and off the field. The award recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Ragland returned to the Capstone in 2015 to complete his degree in consumer affairs, fulfilling a promise he made to his mother that he would earn a degree while at The University of Alabama. He has also stood out not only on the football field, but also in the community where he has put in 50-plus hours of community service.

The acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot for media, coaches and fans to select the award's winner.

#### **ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL**

Alabama has been ranked in 732 of the 1,094 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 444-127-8 (.774) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including an 86-15 (.851) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 120th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started four seasons at No. 1 (2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

#### **ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL**

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 25 seasons (1991-2015), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011 and 2012 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and four USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011 & 2012) coaches poll national titles.

**ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE:** The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won nine national championships in five different sports and 20 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2014-15 academic year football and gymnastics.
- The overall cumulative grade point average of UA student-athletes in 2014-15 was 3.031.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2014-15.
- 114 Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status last year, a total made up of 48 in the Fall of 2014 and 66 in the Winter of 2015.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 103 Academic All-America honors, which ranks third nationally over that span behind only Nebraska (127) and Notre Dame (120). Alabama passed Penn State in 2014-15 (94) with Stanford rounding out the top five at 92.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTES**

**VETERAN DEFENSE:** The Alabama defense includes seven starters from a season ago. Those seven return 330 total tackles, 40 tackles for loss and nine sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, five come from the Tide front seven, including Jonathan Allen who collected 11.5 tackles for a combined loss of 44 yards, both totals that ranked second on the team in 2014. Senior defensive leader and inside linebacker Reggie Ragland returns as well after recording 95 total tackles, 10.5 of which were for a loss, to rank second last year.

**HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE:** Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense, led by coordinator Kirby Smart and head coach Nick Saban, has surrendered only 126 touchdowns over the last 84 games. That is 35 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 161).

**HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300:** On Sept. 26, Alabama limited ULM to 92 yards of total offense, the third time the Tide has kept a team under 300 in 2015. UA also limited Middle Tennessee to 275 yards of offense, one week after holding Wisconsin to 268 yards of total offense in the season opener. In head coach Nick Saban's 112-game tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 69 times, or 61.6 percent of the time. UA held six of its 14 opponents below 300 yards last season.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: During head coach Nick Saban's last 98 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 33 times, most recently against ULM on Sept. 26. The Tide accomplished the feat twice last season, including against Texas A&M on Oct. 18 and versus Florida Atlantic in a weather-shortened contest to open the home schedule on Sept. 6. Alabama limited opponents to 200 or less four times in 2013. In 2012, Alabama did so five times, and in 2011, the Tide accomplished the feat eight times, limiting Kent State to 90 yards and LSU to only 92 yards in the BCS Championship Game (the second and third times a Saban defense has limited its opponent to less than 100 yards of total offense). Alabama's best came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense. UA held opponents under 200 yards three times in 2010, four times in 2009 and six times in 2008.

**10 POINTS OR FEWER:** Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or fewer 53 times since the start of the 2007 season, most recently in a 34-0 shutout win over the ULM Warhawks on Sept. 26. Prior to that contest, Alabama limited Middle Tennessee to 10 points in the Tide's 37-10 win over the Blue Raiders on Sept. 12. Last year, Alabama shut out two opponents, including Texas A&M on Oct. 18. Alabama held 9-of-13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents in the 0-10 point range in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. UA kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009, and in 2007 posted two games in which it held opponents to 0-10 points. Alabama has shut out the opposition 16 times during the Saban era.

**TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND:** Running the ball is no easy task against the Alabama defense with the Tide yielding only two rushing scores this season. Last weekend against ULM, Alabama allowed the Warhawks just nine yards on 31 attempts. Prior to that, on Sept. 12, the Crimson Tide limited Middle Tennessee to 86 rushing yards on 31 attempts a week after stifling a potent Wisconsin rushing attack in the AdvoCare Classic, allowing only 40 total yards to the Badger rushers on 21 carries. The Crimson Tide continued the trend from a season ago, where the defense allowed only five rushing touchdowns in 14 games, the fewest in the nation (UCF was second with nine). The Tide lead the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 73. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 57 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 87 since 2007.

**RUSHING DEFENSE:** Alabama has surrendered only 15 individual 100-yard rushing games dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that leads the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival, the Tide has allowed only 10 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliot (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss's BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

**DEFENSE SETS SEASON HIGH FOR SACKS:** The Crimson Tide defense notched six total sacks against ULM, led by sophomore Da'Shawn Hand's 1.5 sacks for -4 yards. The six sacks were the most the Alabama defense has recorded since last season when UA notched six against Texas A&M. Alabama had four of its six sacks in the first half against the Warhawks, to eclipse the previous singlegame season-high of three that the defense accumulated against Wisconsin.

**FITZPATRICK COLLECTS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES:** Freshman defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick entered halftime of the ULM game with a team-leading six total tackles to eclipse his previous career high of five. Fitzpatrick finished last weekend's game against the Warhawks with a team-high seven tackles. The first-year player previously had a high of five stops in the season opener against Wisconsin.

**HARRISON RECORDS FIRST CAREER PICK:** Freshman defensive back Ronnie Harrison recorded the first interception of his career against ULM. The first-year player entered the contest with the Warhawks with two tackles and a quarterback hurry, while also having a blocked punt in the Middle Tennessee game.

Offense Defense Specialists RAGLAND LEADING THE TIDE D: Senior linebacker Reggie Ragland has been a force on the defense. The Tide's captain in the middle has a team-leading 34 tackles, including 1.5 for a loss (-5 yards), to go with one pass breakup, quarterback hurry and forced fumble. The the first three games of the 2015 season, Ragland led the Alabama defense in stops, including nine tackles against Ole Miss, the seventh time in his career that he led the Tide in tackles. His other four games came a season ago when the linebacker stepped up for the Crimson Tide and finished second on the team with 95 total tackles while accounting for 10.5 tackles for loss (-27 yards), 1.5 sacks (-12 yards), one interception, three pass breakups, three fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and a quarterback hurry.

**TIDE FORCING TURNOVERS VS. MTSU:** Alabama forced four total turnovers on Sept. 12 against Middle Tennessee, with three coming in the first half – two fumble recoveries and one interception, and the final coming by way of the fumble once again in the second half. Prior to that, the last time the Crimson Tide forced at least four turnovers in a game was on Sept. 15, 2012, when the Tide forced three fumbles and two interception against Arkansas. In the week prior to the trip to Fayetteville, Alabama forced four turnovers against Western Kentucky including three fumbles and one interception.

#### **OFFENSIVE NOTES**

**RUSHING TO SUCCESS:** Alabama is 71-4 since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, Ole Miss and Ohio State in 2014, and Ole Miss in 2015.

**FIRST HALF POINTS:** With Derrick Henry's three-yard plunge into the end zone on UA's third offensive drive of the game against ULM, the Crimson Tide has scored in the first half of the last 107 games played, the longest streak in the nation. The last time UA failed to score in the first half was Sept. 29, 2007, when Alabama and Florida State headed into halftime in a scoreless tie. The Seminoles won that game 21-14. The Tide has scored in the first half of every game since. Alabama has a 91-16 record during the streak.

**SCORING STREAK CONTINUES:** With Derrick Henry's three-yard rush into the end zone in the first quarter of last Saturday's game against ULM, Alabama has scored in 187 consecutive games – the longest streak in program history.

TIDE BACKS MOVING UP IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Both Derrick Henry and Kenyan Drake are continuing to move up the career rushing list this season. In the ULM game, Henry rushed for 55 yards and has now amassed 1,794 yards for his career to rank 22nd all-time. Drake led the Tide against the Warhawks with 65 yards on 10 attempts, moving to 38th on the UA all-time rushing list with 1,302.

**HENRY REACHING THE END ZONE CONSISTENTLY:** With his three-yard plunge into the end zone on the Crimson Tide's third offensive drive against ULM, junior running back Derrick Henry has now recorded at least one rushing touchdown in each of his last nine games. The last time Henry failed to notch a score was in the LSU game last season on Nov. 8, where he rushed eight times for 24 yards. The junior tailback finished his day with 52 yards on 13 carries including one touchdown score.

**DOMINANT LAST SIX GAMES FOR HENRY:** Junior tailback Derrick Henry has been impressive in his last six contests. Including the ULM game, he has amassed 658 yards on 100 carries for a 6.6 yards per carry average, while adding 11 rushing touchdowns in his those outings. He has also collected 105 yards on four receptions.

**HENRY FINDING PAYDIRT:** Junior running back Derrick Henry enters the fifth week of the season tied for fourth nationally in rushing touchdowns with eight. He found the end zone three times in both of the first two games to set career highs while adding one more score against Ole Miss and ULM. Henry is 23rd nationally and fourth in the SEC in rushing yards (422) while ranking 30th in the nation and fourth in the conference in rushing yards per game (105.5).

**RIDLEY NOTCHES FIRST CAREER TD:** Alabama freshman wideout Calvin Ridley hauled in his first career touchdown pass on a 15-yard strike from Jake Coker in the second quarter of ULM game. Ridley entered the contest against the Warhawks with 13 receptions for 87 yards. He finished that game with four catches for 38 yards and a score.

DRAKE RETURNS WITH RESULTS FOR TIDE: Senior tailback Kenyan Drake has made a significant impact on the Crimson Tide offense this season after returning from a lower leg injury suffered a season ago against Ole Miss. Drake has been a weapon in all facets of the game including running the ball, catching passes and returning kicks. This season, the fourth-year back has amassed 155 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries while adding seven catches for 139 yards and a touchdown in the passing-game for a teamhigh 19.9 yards per reception (minimum 10 receptions). He also leads the team with eight total kick returns for 170 yards and a 21.2 average per return. In his first game back this season against Wisconsin, Drake finished the evening with 79 yards on just 10 carries, including a long rush of 43 yards that ended in the Tide end zone. The 43-yard dash was the senior's longest run since he rushed for a 46-yard score against Arkansas in 2013. The Georgia native also caught two passes on the night for 48 yards. In the Middle Tennessee contest, he finished the day with a career-high five receptions and 91 yards with one receiving touchdown, while adding six carries for 40 yards on the ground.

**BALL PROTECTION:** In its past 98 games, the Tide has turned the ball over only 118 times (65 fumbles, 53 interceptions) for 1.20 turnovers per game. Since 2009, that mark is even better as the Tide has turned the ball over only 99 times in 85 games (1.16/gm). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 40 interceptions in 2,321 attempts (1 INT every 58.0 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 16 times. Over that 99-game span, the Tide's top two running backs have recorded 2,470 touches, losing a fumble once every 154.4 touches.

HENRY PASSING THE CENTURY MARK: Derrick Henry's 127-yard performance against Ole Miss pushed him past the century mark for the seventh time in his career. Prior to that, he rushed for 147 yards and three touchdowns on 13 carries against Wisconsin to open the 2015 campaign. Henry had a 141-yard performance against Missouri in the SEC Championship Game last season. He also went for 111 on 20 carries with a score against Florida and 113 on 17 carries with a touchdown against West Virginia in 2014. As a freshman, Henry produced a Sugar Bowl game against Oklahoma that saw the first-year back go for 100 yards on eight attempts with a touchdown, while also collecting 111 yards on six carries with a score against Arkansas.

CAREER HIGHS FOR HENRY: Derrick Henry one-upped himself in the first two games of the 2015 season. The junior tailback produced back-to-back three-touchdown performances to set, and then tie, his career high in consecutive weeks. His three touchdowns in the matchup with Wisconsin marked his career high. His previous high total was two, which he had accomplished three times and most recently against Missouri in the 2014 SEC Championship Game. The junior also recorded 147 yards by night's end of the AdvoCare Classic, eclipsing his previous high of 141 that he produced in that same championship game against Missouri. He followed his season-opening performance with another three touchdown game against Middle Tennessee to match his career high, while adding 96 total yards.

**DRAKE SELECTED TO HORNUNG HONOR ROLL:** Senior Kenyan Drake was selected to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll in recognition of his efforts against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 12. The Tide back produced 202 all-purpose yards, including career highs in yards and receptions. He finished the home opener with five receptions for 91 yards and a touchdown, while adding six carries for 40 yards and three kickoff returns for 71 yards. Drake's longest return went for 40 yards, and his 69-yard reception helped put Alabama in position to score its third touchdown of the day. Each year, the Hornung Award recognizes the most versatile player in major college football.

HENRY NOTCHES THREE WEEKLY AWARDS: Thanks to his career day against the Wisconsin Badgers on Sept. 5, junior running back Derrick Henry was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Offensive Player of the Week and the Maxwell Award (top running back) Player of the Week. In the season opener, Henry rushed for 147 yards on just 13 carries (11.3 ypc) with three total touchdowns, all career marks for the third-year back. He also had four rushes of 10 or more yards while accounting for five first downs. The conference honor was the first of his career.

**OFFENSIVE LINE EARNS NATIONAL ACCLAIM:** The Alabama offense produced 502 yards of total offense, including 34 points and 27 first downs. A main reason for the offensive output was the standout performance by the Crimson Tide offensive line, which earned itself a spot on the Joe Moore Award Honor Roll. Each week, the award recognizes and promotes top-performing units across the country based on six criteria: toughness, effort, teamwork, physicality, tone setting and finishing.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**GRIFFITH GOOD ON FIELD GOALS:** Junior kicker Adam Griffith was a perfect 2-for-2 on field goals in the ULM game, with kicks from 40 and 35 yards. The field goals marked three in a row made after missing his first four attempts of the year. Griffith is also a perfect 18-of-18 on extra points.

A NEW JONES RETURNS THE PUNTS: With the departure of veteran punt returner Christion Jones, senior defensive back Cyrus Jones stepped in to fill that void. In four games this season, Cyrus has returned 12 punts for 69 yards with a long return of 22 yards. Prior to this season, he had returned 12 total punts for 143 yards with a long return of 70 yards that came last season against Florida Atlantic. Jones returned a career-high four punts against ULM this past Saturday. His four returns in the season opener against Wisconsin tied his previous career high, which he also collected against Tennessee as a freshman in 2012.

**TIDE RECOVERS ONSIDE KICK:** With the Alabama trailing by 13 and under four minutes to play against Ole Miss, the Tide kicked its first onside kick of the season. The boot from placekicker Adam Griffith was placed perfectly with sophomore defensive back Tony Brown recovering the bounce. The onside kick execution was UA's first since Oct. 20, 2007 vs. Tennessee, when Jamie Christensen's game-opening kick was recovered successfully by linebacker Demarcus Waldrop. UA would go on to win that game, 41-17.

**BLOCKED PUNT FOR BAMA VS. MTSU:** Crimson Tide freshman defensive back Ronnie Harrison blocked Middle Tennessee's punt attempt late in the second quarter of the Tide's home opener on Sept. 12 for a safety. The last time Alabama blocked a punt attempt was Sept. 21, 2013, when Kenyan Drake blocked a Colorado State punt attempt inside Bryant-Denny Stadium.

#### **SERIES NOTES**

**ALABAMA-GEORGIA SERIES:** Alabama leads the Georgia series, 37-25-4, in a rivalry that dates back to 1895. The Crimson Tide also owns the 14-10 advantage when the two teams meet in Athens. The last matchup on the UGA campus came in 2008, with the Tide earning a 41-30 victory over the Bulldogs. In the most recent meeting, UA claimed its 23rd Southeastern Conference Championship with a 32-28 victory over Georgia in 2012, securing the Tide's spot in the national championship game. Alabama would go on to defeat Notre Dame, 41-14, earning the program's 15th national championship in program history.

**SABAN VS. GEORGIA:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a career 4-2 record against Georgia, including a 2-1 mark during his time in Tuscaloosa. His first meeting with the Bulldogs came while he was at LSU, a 17-10 victory for the Tigers in Baton Rouge. While at Alabama, he fell in his initial matchup with the Bulldogs in 2007 inside Bryant-Denny Stadium, before claiming a 41-30 win in Athens the very next year. Most recently, Saban's Crimson Tide earned a 32-28 win inside the Georgia Dome in Atlanta for the program's 23rd SEC Championship on the way to winning Alabama's 15th national championship.

**GEORGIA CONNECTIONS:** The Crimson Tide roster features 14 players from the state of Georgia, the second most of any location behind only Alabama. The list of Georgia natives includes: Dakota Ball (TE), Mekhi Brown (LB), Hunter Bryant (TE), Kenyan Drake (RB), Johnny Dwight (TE), Ty Flournoy-Smith (TE), Brandon Greene (TE/OL), Adam Griffith (PK), Dillon Lee (LB), Armani Purifoye (WR), Geno Matias-Smith (DB), Adonis Thomas (LB), Dalvin Tomlinson (DL) and Dallas Warmack (OL). The Georgia football staff also features numerous former Alabama player, coaches and graduates, including Jeremy Pruitt, Rob Sale, Kevin Sherrer and Mark Hocke.

#### **GENERAL NOTES**

**SABAN'S ROAD RECORD:** Head coach Nick Saban owns a 56-29-1 mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 28-6 mark while at Alabama. Saban has notched four perfect road seasons (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012) and has lost more than one game on the road in only two seasons (2007, 2010). He is currently riding a three-game winning streak, rebounding from an early season loss in Oxford to Ole Miss to come back and defeat Arkansas (14-13), Tennessee (34-20) and LSU (20-13 OT) on the way to winning the SEC Western Division and eventually the Crimson Tide's 24th SEC Championship in program history.

**COACH SABAN IN SEC ROAD OPENERS:** Nick Saban is 9-4 all-time in Southeastern Conference road openers spanning his time at Alabama and LSU. He is 7-1 in road conference openers during his time with the Crimson Tide and has outscored his opponents, 294-153 (36.8-19.1 ppg) in his first eight seasons with Alabama.

**SABAN VS. SEC OPPONENTS:** Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban owns an 87-26 career record in 113 games against SEC opponents across three different stops. While at Alabama, he has compiled a 57-13 record across conference foes, and is outscoring opponents by a staggering 2,852-1,089, or 40.7-15.6 points per game. Of his 13 losses against SEC opponents while at Alabama, all but two (Florida, 2008 and South Carolina, 2010) have been by seven points or less. Saban's first matchup with an SEC team came in the 1995 Independence Bowl against LSU, where his Michigan State Spartans fell, 45-26, to the Tigers. He would later go on to coach LSU to 30-12 overall record against conference opponents.

**SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular-season games against conference opponents with 86. His 86 wins rank seventh in SEC history, five wins ahead of current Georgia head coach Mark Richt (81) on the league's list of conference wins. Each coach ahead of them on the list, except for South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier, is in the College Football Hall of Fame. Paul "Bear" Bryant tops the list with 159 conference wins at Kentucky (1946-53) and Alabama (1958-82). Spurrier is second with 131 league wins followed by John Vaught (Ole Miss, 106), Vince Dooley (Georgia, 105), Ralph "Shug" Jordan (Auburn, 98) and Phillip Fulmer (Tennessee, 98). Saban ranks second in league history in SEC regular-season winning percentage at .777 (87-25). He is fifth in league history in all-time winning percentage at .801 (137-34) and ranks 12th all-time for career wins.

TIDE 87-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: The Crimson Tide is 87-6 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban. UA was ahead 14-0 entering halftime a week ago with ULM with the eventual 34-0 win by day's end. Alabama went into half with a 23-3 lead over Middle Tennessee before coming away with the 37-10 win in the 2015 home opener. The Tide claimed a 35-17 victory over Wisconsin after heading into half with a 14-7 lead in the 2015 season opener. UA had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide had also converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. The first two losses in the current run (when leading at the break) came against LSU, followed by a defeat to Auburn in 2010. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 3-7 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 3-3 when tied at halftime. The three wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; and 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010. And Alabama's three wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21) and against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6).

**ALABAMA'S TV RECORD:** Alabama has compiled a 228-131-4 (.634) all-time record in 363 televised games (not including payper-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

82 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 98 GAMES: Following the ULM contest, Alabama has now participated in 82 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest in the past two seasons. The Tide began the season on ABC with the network carrying the AdvoCare Classic matchup with Wisconsin, before airing live on the SEC Network for the Middle Tennessee contest. Alabama was then featured on ESPN for the Ole Miss game. A season ago, UA was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. The Tide played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one game on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, UA played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

**ALABAMA-WISCONSIN DRAWS HUGE RATINGS:** The season opening matchup on ABC's *Saturday Night Football* between the Alabama Crimson Tide and Wisconsin Badgers was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 4.3 overnight rating nationally, which was up five percent from the same window last season (Oklahoma State vs. Florida State). More impressively, the game received a 46.7 rating in Birmingham which is the highest-rated regular season game on ABC dating back to 2004.

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: Alabama had some new faces on the field for the season opener against the Wisconsin Badgers. True freshmen Shawn Burgess-Becker (DB), Lester Cotton (OL), Minkah Fitzpatrick (DB), Damien Harris (RB), Ronnie Harrison (DB), Daron Payne (DL), Calvin Ridley (WR) and Dallas Warmack (OL) all saw action. In addition, redshirt freshmen Keith Holcombe (LB), Marlon Humphrey (DB) and Christian Miller (LB) made their first appearance. Oregon State transfer Richard Mullaney (WR) made his first appearance in a Crimson Tide uniform as well.

**NEW HIRES:** Nick Saban made two new additions to his 2015 staff during the offseason, hiring Tosh Lupoi to coach the outside linebackers and bringing in Mel Tucker to lead the secondary. Lupoi enters a full-time role after serving as an analyst a season ago. He has previous experience as an assistant coach at Washington and Cal, where he coached future first-rounders Danny Shelton, Cameron Jordan and Tyson Alualu. Tucker joins the Crimson Tide staff following a two-year stint as the defensive coordinator of the NFL's Chicago Bears. Tucker also served as defensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2009-12) and Cleveland Browns (2008). He originally linked up with Saban as a graduate assistant at Michigan State in 1997 and stayed in East Lansing for two years.

**CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS:** The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2015-16 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 40 former players (35 active, five injured reserve, practice squad or currently suspended) earning a spot on an NFL roster this season. The Tide currently has the third-most players on an active NFL roster, with LSU at the top with 38 players just one ahead of second place Miami (Fla.). Alabama leads all colleges in producing offensive linemen, with eight currently spotting NFL rosters.

In the last seven NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 48 players selected, including 17 players in first round, 11 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 180-60-1 (.749) record as a college head coach to date. He has four national championships - three at Alabama - six conference championships and 16 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships. He is the only coach to win back-toback BCS national championships and has won four titles in his last nine years coaching college football. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the fourth coach in he poll era to win four national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant, John McKay and Leahy).
- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game.
- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.
- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).
- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.
- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.
- · Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.
- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.
- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise approximately \$5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 15 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that stuck Tuscaloosa.
- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

**ARLINGTON, Texas** — The University of Alabama's junior running back Derrick Henry had a career day, rushing 13 times for 147 yards and three touchdowns to lead the No. 3 Crimson Tide past No. 20 Wisconsin 35-17 in the Advocare Classic inside AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas. Henry opened up the game's scoring, breaking off a 37-yard run in the first quarter to put Alabama ahead 7-0. He put up two more scores in the third quarter, including a 56-yard touchdown rush that put him over 100 yards for the night, the sixth time in his career he has eclipsed the century mark in a game.

Senior quarterback Jake Coker, making his debut as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback, was an efficient 15-of-21 for 213 yards and one touchdown to go along with no turnovers. Sophomore Cooper Bateman also saw action in the second half, finishing 7-for-8 with 51 yards. Defensively, Alabama was dominant at the line of scrimmage, holding the Badgers to just 40 yards rushing on 21 attempts, an average of 1.9 yards per rush. Senior linebacker recorded 12 total tackles, including five solo. Additionally, Jonathan Allen had two sacks and the team broke up seven passes on the night.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — The 12th-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide shut out the visiting ULM Warhawks by a final score of 34-0 in front of 101,323 fans at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide got off to another slow start offensively, getting on the board with 2:38 remaining in the first quarter thanks to a three-yard run by junior running back Derrick Henry. Senior quarterback Jacob Coker found freshman wide receiver Calvin Ridley for a touchdown early in the second quarter, the first of the rookie's career. In the second half, Alabama was able to put the game away. Junior placekicker Adam Griffith made field goals of 35 and 40 yards, and Coker tossed two more touchdowns.

Defensively, the Tide dominated ULM. For the game, the Alabama defense allowed a total of 92 yards from scrimmage, the fewest yards given up by an Alabama defense since the 2012 BCS Championship Game against LSU, when the Tigers also gained 92 yards of offense. The defense also recorded six quarterback sacks and 12 tackles for loss.
