THE GAME: The No. 2/2 University of Alabama football team welcomes the No. 15/11 Ole Miss Rebels to Bryant-Denny Stadium for the Crimson Tide's Southeastern Conference opener. The matchup is scheduled for an 8:15 p.m. CT kickoff on ESPN with Chris Fowler and Kirk Herbstreit in the booth and Heather Cox on the sidelines once again. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter. Westwood One will carry the game on national radio as well.

RANKINGS: Alabama enters week three remaining slotted as the No. 2 team in both major polls. Ole Miss enters the new week ranked as the No. 15 team in the Associated Press Poll and No. 11 in the Amway Coaches Poll.

OLE MISS: The Rebels are traveling to Tuscaloosa for the third time in the past four seasons and enter Bryant-Denny Stadium with a 2-0 record following a 73-21 win at home against Fresno State. Ole Miss is led by Hugh Freeze who has a 26-15 record spanning his four seasons in Oxford. The Rebels finished 9-4 a season ago ending with a postseason appearance in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss returns 56 lettermen from a season ago, including 18 starters, while losing 27 letterwinners and seven starters.

SERIES HISTORY: Alabama and Ole Miss will meet for the 64th time in a series that dates back to 1894. The Crimson Tide owns the all-time advantage, 47-10-2 (51-9-2 actual), including a 25-1 mark when playing as the home team. Alabama has won its last 12 games at home over Ole Miss, but fell in the most recent meeting between the two teams as the Rebels snapped the Tide's 10-game series winning streak with a 23-17 win in Oxford a season ago.

COACH SABAN IN SEC HOME OPENERS: Nick Saban is 12-1 all-time in Southeastern Conference home openers spanning his time at Alabama and LSU. He is a perfect 8-0 at Alabama and is currently in the midst of an 11-game winning streak in SEC home openers dating back to 2002 when he began his third conference slate at LSU with a 31-13 win over Mississippi State. Saban's teams outscored its opponents by a score of 397-184, including a 245-86 mark during his eight years at Alabama.

NEXT GAME: Alabama will host Louisiana-Monroe for the third all-time meeting next Saturday, Sept. 26. The two teams have split the series, with UA claiming a 41-7 win in 2006 (later vacated by NCAA ruling) before falling 21-14 to the Warhawks in 2007.

"BLOW THE WHISTLE" ON CANCER: When Alabama takes the field this Saturday against Ole Miss, their coaches and players will be highlighting September as National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. The Crimson Tide will join seven other SEC programs in helping to create pediatric cancer awareness. Working with Atlanta-based nonprofit Curing Kids Cancer, the Tide's players and coaches will kick off with the charity's third annual *Blow the Whistle on Kids Cancer!* campaign. The coaches will wear gold whistles and lanyards imprinted with the Coaches Curing Kids Cancer logo and both players and coaches will wear Curing Kids Cancer wristbands.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY: Alabama will be making its 34th (21-12 record) appearance on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show broadcasts from the Walk of Champions at Bryant-Denny Stadium Saturday prior to the SEC opener between the Crimson Tide and Ole Miss Rebels. It will mark Alabama's 25th appearance under head coach Nick Saban (18-6). The 25 appearances in the Saban era are four better than Oregon for the most GameDay appearances since the 2007 season. It will be the seventh time College GameDay has visited Tuscaloosa since Coach Saban arrived in 2007. Alabama owns a 4-2 record in those games with wins over Penn State (2010), LSU (2013), Mississippi State (2014) and Auburn (2014). The Tide fell to Georgia in 2007 and LSU in 2011. This Saturday against Ole Miss will be the 11th appearance by College GameDay on Alabama's campus, which is tied for the third most in the ESPN program's history (Ohio State 13; Florida 12; Florida State 11).

FACING OFF WITH THE BEST: The Crimson Tide has the toughest schedule in college football this season, according to ESPN.com's College Football Power Index. Southeastern Conference teams represent 13 of the 25 toughest schedules in college football, per that same index. Alabama faces off with 10 teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago, joining only three other teams in the nation to face the same gauntlet (also, Arkansas, Vanderbilt, Virginia). Only 14 teams nationally square off with at least nine opponents who went bowling a season ago.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in only three regular season games without national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications for the Tide in the past eight years (81 of 84 games).

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 12 starters and 54 letterwinners from its 2014 squad that finished 12-2 as the SEC Western Division and SEC champions. The 2015 team returns seven starters on a veteran defense including Jonathan Allen, Denzel Devall, Eddie Jackson, Cyrus Jones, Reggie Ragland, Jarran Reed and A'Shawn Robinson. The offense welcomes back the staples of its offensive line in center Ryan Kelly and left tackle Cam Robinson.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: The Crimson Tide had two players make their first start in last Saturday's contest against Middle Tennessee, including Minkah Fitzpatrick (DB) and Dakota Ball (TE). In the season opener with Wisconsin, seven students made their first career start, including three on defense and four on offense. Getting their first career nod on defense were Marlon Humphrey (DB), Darren Lake (DT) and Shaun Dion Hamilton (LB). The offensive starters were made up of Jake Coker (QB), Robert Foster (WR), Dominick Jackson (OL) and Ross Pierschbacher (OT).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama pushed its winning streak to 17 games with Saturday's 37-10 win over Middle Tennessee. The Crimson Tide has not lost a game at home since falling to Texas A&M in 2012. It equals the longest home winning streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision (Baylor, 17). Alabama also boasts the fifth-best home winning percentage in the FBS inside Bryant-Denny Stadium with an .819 mark (240-52-3) since the stadium opened in 1929. Baylor's McLane Stadium, which opened last season (7-0, 1.000) is the leader while Georgia Southern's Paulson Stadium (.847) and Marshall's Edwards Stadium (.846) rank second and third, respectively. Boise State's home field, Albertsons Stadium, comes in fourth with an .828 winning percentage, just ahead of Alabama at five.

SWEET HOME ALABAMA: Bryant-Denny Stadium has been a very comfortable setting for the Crimson Tide dating back to last season. The statistics have told the story of the Tide's 8-0 record that helped extend the team's winning streak to 17 games. Alabama has outscored its opponents by a staggering 359-121 in its last eight home games (44.9-15.1).

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 86 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013 and 12-2 in 2014. Boise State is second with 82 wins while Oregon is third with 81 victories.

CONSISTENTLY TOP 10: Alabama has cemented itself amongst the top 10 teams in the Associated Press poll over the last five seasons. Entering 2015, the Crimson Tide had appeared in the AP top 10 every single week since the start of the final poll of the 2010 season, where UA finished 10th. The Tide has appeared in the top 10 for 69 consecutive weeks, the longest active streak and seventh-longest streak in the history of the poll.

BEATING THE BEST: Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide is 32-11 (.744) against the Associated Press top 25, including an 18-6 (.750) mark against AP top-10 teams. This season, the Tide will face off against seven teams in the AP preseason poll, the most ranked opposition of any team in the nation. Alabama finished 5-2 in 2014 against opponents ranked in the AP top 25 after going 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 against the AP top 25 in 2010.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former UA players selected in the 2015 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Amari Cooper who went fourth overall to the Oakland Raiders, the Tide's highest selection since Trent Richardson went third overall in 2012. Safety Landon Collins was the next to go (33rd, New York Giants) followed by T.J. Yeldon (36th, Jacksonville Jaguars) with both players being selected in the second round. Versatile back Jalston Fowler followed Yeldon, being selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the Tennessee Titans. Also going in the fourth round was offensive lineman Arie Kouandjio who went 112th overall to the Washington Redskins. The Tide's final pair of draft picks came in the seventh round, with offensive lineman Austin Shepherd going to the Minnesota Vikings at pick 228 and linebacker Xzavier Dickson going at pick 253 to the Super Bowl Champion New England Patriots.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last five years (37) than any other college in the nation. Fourteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 19 have gone in the first two rounds of the NFL Draft. The list of 37 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 730 of the 1,092 *Associated Press* college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 443-126-8 (.775) all-time record in games when ranked in the *Associated Press* college football poll, including an 85-14 (.859) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 118th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started four seasons at No. 1 (2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. *USA TODAY* has administered the poll for the past 25 seasons (1991-2015), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011 and 2012 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and four *USA TODAY* (1992, 2009, 2011 & 2012) coaches poll national titles.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past eight seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2015 squad features four players who already have degrees in hand before the opening kick of the Wisconsin game. Over the past eight seasons (2008-present) Alabama has seen **94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate)** by players still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after already having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive **11 players earn a master's degree** before stepping foot on the field.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Crimson Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the highlights of the Tide's academic successes under head coach Nick Saban.

- An NCAA-leading seven members of the SEC championship team that participated in the 2015 College Football Playoff Semifinal game had already earned a master's degree.
- For the second consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).
- Alabama's last three national title football teams included 60 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That same team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the 2011 SEC Academic Honor Roll
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- Alabama has led the Southeastern Conference in number of football student-athletes being named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

KELLY'S CLASSROOM SUCCESS: Senior Ryan Kelly has been a staple on the Crimson Tide offensive line for each of his four seasons in Tuscaloosa, but just as impressive are his academic talents. The Tide center graduated last summer with his undergraduate degree in marketing and is currently enrolled in classes working towards his master's degree in the same specialization, which he is scheduled to receive this December. During his undergraduate career he was named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll three times, the SEC Freshman Honor Roll and the Dean's list in both semesters of 2013. Kelly currently holds a 3.75 grade point average in his graduate studies.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: What Alabama football does off the field is equally as important as their successes on the field. Last season alone, the Crimson Tide put in 200-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals and on campus.

RAGLAND PUTTING IN WORK: Senior linebacker Reggie Ragland has dedicated himself to volunteering in the community each of his four seasons, contributing numerous service hours each season. Across his first three years in Tuscaloosa, Ragland put together an impressive list of volunteering opportunities and has gone above and beyond what is asked of Alabama football student-athletes. In all, he has totaled more than 50 hours of community service across double-digit volunteer opportunities that include visits to hospitals, schools and churches. Ragland has also visited veterans numerous times at local VA hospitals.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD NOMINEE - REGGIE RAGLAND: Reggie Ragland was selected as one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to student-athletes who excel both on and off the field. The award recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Ragland returned to the Capstone in 2015 to complete his degree in consumer affairs, fulfilling a promise he made to his mother that he would earn a degree while at The University of Alabama. He has also stood out not only on the football field, but also in the community where he has put in 50-plus hours of community service.

The acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot for media, coaches and fans to select the award's winner.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won nine national championships in five different sports and 20 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2014-15 academic year - football and gymnastics.
- The overall cumulative grade point average of UA student-athletes in 2014-15 was 3.031.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2014-15.
- 114 Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status last year, a total made up of 48 in the Fall of 2014 and 66 in the Winter of 2015.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 103 Academic All-America honors, which ranks third nationally over that span behind only Nebraska (127) and Notre Dame (120). Alabama passed Penn State in 2014-15 (94) with Stanford rounding out the top five at 92.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

VETERAN DEFENSE: The Alabama defense includes seven starters from a season ago. Those seven return 330 total tackles, 40 tackles for loss and nine sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, five come from the Tide front seven, including Jonathan Allen who collected 11.5 tackles for a combined loss of 44 yards, both totals that ranked second on the team in 2014. Senior defensive leader and inside linebacker Reggie Ragland returns as well after recording 95 total tackles, 10.5 of which were for a loss, to rank second on last year's team.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense, led by coordinator Kirby Smart and head coach Nick Saban, has surrendered just 121 touchdowns over the last 82 games. That is 34 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 155).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: Alabama limited Middle Tennessee to 275 yards of offense, one week after holding Wisconsin to 268 yards of total offense in the season opener. In head coach Nick Saban's 110-game tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 68 times, or 61.8 percent of the time. UA held six of 14 opponents below 300 yards last season.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: During head coach Nick Saban's last 96 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 32 times, most recently against Texas A&M on Oct. 18, 2014, which was the second time the Tide accomplished the feat in 2014 after doing it four times in 2013. In 2012, Alabama did so five times, and in 2011, the Tide accomplished the feat eight times, limiting Kent State to 90 yards and LSU to only 92 yards in the BCS Championship Game (the second and third times a Saban defense has limited its opponent to less than 100 yards of total offense). Alabama's best came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense. UA held opponents under 200 yards three times in 2010, four times in 2009 and six times in 2008.

10 POINTS OR FEWER: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or fewer 52 times since the start of the 2007 season, with its most recent game coming in the 37-10 home opener win over Middle Tennessee last Saturday. Last season, Alabama shut out two opponents, including Texas A&M most recently. Alabama held 9-of-13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents in the 0-10 point range in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. UA kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009, and in 2007 posted two games in which it held opponents to 0-10 points. Alabama has shut out the opposition 15 times during the Saban era.

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Running the ball is no easy task against the Alabama defense with the Tide having yet to allow a rushing touchdown this season. The Crimson Tide limited Middle Tennessee to 86 rushing yards on 31 attempts a week after stifling a potent Wisconsin rushing attack in the AdvoCare Classic, allowing just 40 total yards to the Badger rushers on 21 carries. The Crimson Tide continued the trend from a season ago, where the defense allowed a lowly five rushing touchdowns in 14 games, which was the fewest in the nation (UCF was second with nine). The Tide lead the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 73. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 55 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 86 since 2007.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Limiting opposing running backs to fewer than 100 yards is nothing new for the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 15 individual 100-yard rushing games dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that leads the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival, the Tide has allowed only 10 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliot (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss's BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

TIDE FORCING TURNOVERS VS. MTSU: Alabama forced four total turnovers by night's end in last weekend's contest against MTSU, with three coming in the first half – two fumble recoveries and one interception, and the final coming by way of the fumble once again in the second half. The last time the Crimson Tide forced at least four turnovers in a game was on Sept. 15, 2012, when the Tide forced three fumbles and two interception against Arkansas. In the week prior to the trip to Fayetteville, Alabama forced four turnovers against Western Kentucky including three fumbles and one interception.

RAGLAND LEADING THE TIDE D: For the second time in as many games this season, Reggie Ragland led the Alabama defense, this time with nine tackles in the Middle Tennessee game, which was also the sixth time in his career that he has led the Tide in stops. His other four games all came a season ago when the linebacker stepped up for the Crimson Tide and finished second on the team with 95 total tackles while accounting for 10.5 tackles for loss (-27 yards), 1.5 sacks (-12 yards), one interception, three pass breakups, three fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and a quarterback hurry. His 2014 season highlights included a 13-tackle performance, with four solos and one for loss, at LSU, and 10 stops against No. 1 Mississippi State.

DEVAL SETS A CAREER HIGH FOR TACKLES: Senior Denzel Devall finished last Saturday's home opener against MTSU with seven total tackles, including three solo and one for a loss. The linebacker's previous career high was four, which he accomplished three times in his career with the last time coming vs. LSU in 2013.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama is 71-3 since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, and Ole Miss and Ohio State in 2014.

BALL PROTECTION: In its past 96 games, the Tide has turned the ball over only 112 times (63 fumbles, 49 interceptions) for 1.16 turnovers per game. Since 2009, that mark is even better as the Tide has turned the ball over only 93 times in 83 games (1.12/gm). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 36 interceptions in 2,231 attempts (1 INT every 62.0 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 16 times. Over that 97-game span, the Tide's top two running backs have recorded 2,413 touches, losing a fumble once every 150.8 touches.

FIRST HALF POINTS: With Robert Foster's 19-yard reception from Jake Coker on the Crimson Tide's second drive of the MTSU game, Alabama has scored in the first half of the last 105 games played, the longest streak in the nation. The last time the Tide failed to score in the first half was Sept. 29, 2007, when Alabama and Florida State headed into halftime in a scoreless tie. The Seminoles won the game 21-14. The Tide has scored in the first half of every game since. Alabama has a 90-15 record during the streak.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: With Robert Foster's 19-yard touchdown reception from Jake Coker on Alabama's second offensive drive of the home opener against Middle Tennessee, the Crimson Tide has scored in 185 consecutive games – the longest streak in program history.

TIDE BACKS MOVING UP IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Both Derrick Henry and Kenyan Drake moved up the career rushing list with their performances in the Middle Tennessee game. Henry, who led the Crimson Tide offense with 96 yards rushing, jumped to 25th on the UA all-time list at 1,615 yards total for his career. With his 40 yards rushing, Drake rose to 42nd on the UA all-time career rushing yards list with 1,204 across his four seasons in Crimson and White.

HENRY FINDING PAYDIRT: Junior running back Derrick Henry enters the third week of the season leading the nation in rushing touchdowns with six. He has found the end zone three times in each of the first two games to set career highs. He is currently eighth nationally and second in the SEC in points responsible and ranks 14th and third respectively in yards per carry (7.84). Henry is 19th nationally and second in the SEC in rushing yards (243) while ranking 21st in the nation and third in the conference in rushing yards per game (121.3).

CAREER HIGHS FOR HENRY: Derrick Henry has been one-upping himself in the first two games this season. The junior tailback put together back-to-back three-touchdown performances to set and then tie his career high in consecutive weeks. His three touchdowns in the matchup with Wisconsin marked his career high. His previous high total was two, which he had accomplished three times and most recently against Missouri in the 2014 SEC Championship Game. The junior also recorded 147 yards by night's end of the AdvoCare Classic, eclipsing his previous high of 141 that he put together in that same championship game against Missouri.

HENRY DOMINANT IN LAST FOUR GAMES: Junior tailback Derrick Henry has been impressive in his last four contests. Including the Middle Tennessee game, he has amassed 479 yards on 64 carries for a 7.5 yards per carry average, while adding nine rushing touchdowns in his last four outings. He has also collected 66 yards on four receptions.

DRAKE SELECTED TO HORNUNG HONOR ROLL: Senior Kenyan Drake was selected to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll in recognition of his efforts against Middle Tennessee. The Tide back put together 202 all-purpose yards, including career highs in yards and receptions. He finished the home opener with five receptions for 91 yards and a touchdown, while adding six carries for 40 yards and three kickoff returns for 71 yards. Drake's longest return went for 40 yards, and his 69-yard reception helped put Alabama in position to score its third touchdown of the day. Each year, the Hornung Award recognizes the most versatile player in major college football.

CAREER HIGH IN YARDS, RECEPTIONS FOR DRAKE: In last weekend's matchup with MTSU, running back Kenyan Drake hauled in his fourth pass of the game, a 14-yard screen pass for a score from Cooper Bateman on the Tide's first drive of the second half, to pass his previous high of three receptions in a game. The reception also moved him to 94 yards receiving on the day to set a new career high for yards, as well. His previous mark was 87 yards against Florida in 2014. The senior back finished the day with five receptions for 91 yards and one receiving touchdown in addition to six carries for 40 yards on the ground.

DRAKE RETURNS WITH RESULTS FOR TIDE: Senior tailback Kenyan Drake made a significant impact on the Crimson Tide offense in the Wisconsin game, his first contest since breaking his lower left leg a season ago in the Ole Miss. Drake finished the evening with 79 yards on just 10 carries, including a long rush of 43 yards that ended in the Tide end zone. The 43-yard dash was the senior's longest run since he rushed for a 46-yard score against Arkansas in 2013. The Georgia native also caught two passes on the night for 48 yards.

COKER SETS A CAREER HIGH: With his eight-yard pass to Kenyan Drake just before the end of the first half against MTSU, senior quarterback Jake Coker moved his first-half total to 214 yards through the air. That yardage total was more than his previous career high for a game of 213, which he accumulated against Wisconsin to open the 2015 campaign. Coker did not return at quarterback following the halftime break in last weekend's game.

BATEMAN THROWS FIRST CAREER TD PASS: Sophomore Cooper Bateman's 14-yard shovel pass to Kenyan Drake in the Middle Tennessee game was the first touchdown pass of his career. Bateman's first career pass came last week against Wisconsin.

HOWARD HAULS IN A CAREER HIGH FOR RECEPTIONS: With his eight-yard reception from Cooper Bateman in the third quarter of last weekend's home opener with Middle Tennessee, O.J. Howard set a new career high mark for receptions with four. The junior tight end would finish the day with four receptions for 68 yards.

HENRY NOTCHES THREE WEEKLY AWARDS: Thanks to his career day against the Wisconsin Badgers, junior running back Derrick Henry was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Offensive Player of the Week and the Maxwell Award (top running back) Player of the Week. In the season opener, Henry put together 147 yards on just 13 carries (11.3 ypc) with three total touchdowns, all career marks for the third-year back. He also had four rushes of 10 or more yards while accounting for five first downs. The conference honor was the first of his career.

OFFENSIVE LINE EARNS NATIONAL ACCLAIM: The Alabama offense was able to put together 502 yards of total offense, including 34 points and 27 first downs. A main reason for the offensive output was the standout performance by the Crimson Tide offensive line, which earned itself a spot on the Joe Moore Award Honor Roll. Each week, the award recognizes and promotes top-performing units across the country based on six criteria: toughness, effort, teamwork, physicality, tone setting and finishing.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

BLOCKED PUNT FOR ALABAMA: Crimson Tide freshman defensive back Ronnie Harrison blocked Middle Tennessee's punt attempt late in the second quarter of last weekend's game for a safety. The last time Alabama blocked a punt attempt was Sept. 21, 2013, when Kenyan Drake blocked a Colorado State punt attempt inside Bryant-Denny Stadium.

A NEW JONES RETURNS THE PUNTS: With the departure of two-year punt returner Christian Jones, senior defensive back Cyrus Jones stepped in to fill that void. In two games this season, Cyrus has returned five punts for 30 yards with a long return of 18 yards. Previously in his career, he had returned 12 total punts for 143 yards with a long return of 70 yards that came last season against Florida Atlantic. His four returns in the season opener against Wisconsin tied his previous career high, which he also collected against Tennessee as a freshman in 2012.

SERIES NOTES

ALABAMA-OLE MISS SERIES: Alabama leads the Ole Miss series 47-10-2 (51-9-2 before NCAA rulings) with wins in 27 of the last 30 games dating back to the 1977 season (excluding NCAA rulings). Alabama has won its last 12 games at home over Ole Miss, but fell in the most recent meeting between the two teams as the Rebels snapped the Tide's overall 10-game winning streak with a 23-17 win in Oxford a season ago.

SABAN VS. OLE MISS: Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 10-2 record (11-2 before the vacated win in 2007) in his career against Ole Miss. He is 6-1 at Alabama (7-1 before vacated 2007 win) following last year's 23-17 loss in Oxford. Saban also posted a 4-1 record against Ole Miss while at LSU from 2000-04. His other loss to the Rebels came on Oct. 27, 2001, as Ole Miss posted a 35-24 win in Baton Rouge.

OLE MISS CONNECTIONS: Alabama offensive coordinator Lane Kiffin's brother, Chris, is an assistant coach/defensive line coach for the Rebels. Chris has been with Ole Miss since December of 2011, and also serves as the recruiting coordinator for the defense under head coach Hugh Freeze.

GENERAL NOTES

COACH SABAN IN SEC HOME OPENERS: Nick Saban is 12-1 all-time in Southeastern Conference home openers spanning his time at Alabama and LSU. He is a perfect 8-0 at Alabama and is currently in the midst of an 11-game winning streak in SEC home openers dating back to 2002 when he began his third conference slate at LSU with a 31-13 win over Mississippi State. Saban has outscored his opponents by a score of 397-184, including a 245-86 mark during his eight years at Alabama.

SABAN IN SEC OPENERS: Head coach Nick Saban owns a perfect 8-0 record in SEC openers during his time at Alabama and is 10-3 for his career as a head coach in the Southeastern Conference. While at Alabama, he has outscored his opponents 313-128 (39.1-16.0 ppg) and has claimed one shutout victory, a 52-0 win over Arkansas in 2012. For his career, Saban-coached teams have put up 405 points compared to 221 for opponents. Saban owns a perfect 6-0 record when opening his conference slate at home as opposed to a 4-3 mark when starting SEC play on the road.

SABAN VS. SEC OPPONENTS: Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban owns an 87-25 record in 112 games against SEC opponents across three different stops. While at Alabama, he has compiled a 57-12 record across conference foes, and is outscoring opponents by a staggering 2,815-1,046, or 40.8-15.2 points per game. Of his 12 losses against SEC opponents while at Alabama, all but two (Florida, 2008 and South Carolina, 2010) have been by seven points or less. Saban's first matchup with an SEC team came in the 1995 Independence Bowl against LSU, where his Michigan State Spartans fell, 45-26, to the Tigers. He would later go on to coach LSU to 30-12 overall record against conference opponents.

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular-season games against conference opponents with 86. His 86 wins rank seventh in SEC history, six wins ahead of current Georgia head coach Mark Richt (80) on the league's list of conference wins. Each coach ahead of them on the list, except for South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier, is in the College Football Hall of Fame. Paul "Bear" Bryant tops the list with 159 conference wins at Kentucky (1946-53) and Alabama (1958-82). Spurrier is second with 131 league wins followed by John Vaught (Ole Miss, 106), Vince Dooley (Georgia, 105), Ralph "Shug" Jordan (Auburn, 98) and Phillip Fulmer (Tennessee, 98). Saban ranks second in league history in SEC regular-season winning percentage at .781 (86-24). He is fifth in league history in all-time winning percentage at .804 (136-33) and ranks 12th all-time for career wins.

TIDE 86-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: The Crimson Tide is 86-6 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama went into half with a 23-3 lead over MTSU before coming away with the 37-10 win a weekend ago. The Tide claimed a 35-17 victory over Wisconsin after heading into half with a 14-7 lead in the 2015 season opener. UA had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide had also converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. The first two losses in the current run (when leading at the break) came against LSU, followed by a defeat to Auburn in 2010. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 3-7 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 3-3 when tied at halftime. The three wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; and 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010. And Alabama's three wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21) and against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6).

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 227-130-4 (.634) all-time record in 361 televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

80 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 96 GAMES: Following the home opener with Middle Tennessee, Alabama has now participated in 80 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest in the past two seasons. The Tide began the season on ABC with the network carrying the AdvoCare Classic matchup with Wisconsin. A season ago, UA was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. The Tide played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one game on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, UA played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

ALABAMA-WISCONSIN DRAWS HUGE RATINGS: The season opening matchup on ABC's *Saturday Night Football* between the Alabama Crimson Tide and Wisconsin Badgers was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 4.3 overnight rating nationally, which was up five percent from the same window last season (Oklahoma State vs. Florida State). More impressively, the game received a 46.7 rating in Birmingham which is the highest-rated regular season game on ABC dating back to 2004.

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: Alabama had some new faces on the field for the season opener against the Wisconsin Badgers. True freshmen Shawn Burgess-Becker (DB), Lester Cotton (OL), Minkah Fitzpatrick (DB), Damien Harris (RB), Ronnie Harrison (DB), Daron Payne (DL), Calvin Ridley (WR) and Dallas Warmack (OL) all saw action. In addition, redshirt freshmen Keith Holcombe (LB), Marlon Humphrey (DB) and Christian Miller (LB) made their first appearance. Oregon State transfer Richard Mullaney (WR) made his first appearance in a Crimson Tide uniform as well.

10-WIN SEASONS: With last season's 48-14 victory over Western Carolina, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the seventh consecutive season. The seven straight years with 10 wins extends the school record that was set by the Tide in 2013. Prior to finishing that season with 11 wins, the previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 119 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 34 times, one back of Oklahoma (35) for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced nine 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2014). Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban is the 11th coach in school history to lead his team to a 10-win season and is the fifth coach in school history to have more than one 10-win season. Bryant had a school-record 12 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with seven. Other coaches to reach the milestone include Gene Stallings (4), Wallace Wade (2), Frank Thomas (2), Harold "Red" Drew (1), Ray Perkins (1), Bill Curry (1), Mike DuBose (1), Dennis Franchione (1) and Mike Shula (1).

SEC RECORD: Alabama broke its tie with the Florida teams of 1993 through 1998 for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history when it defeated Western Carolina on Nov. 22 of last season to improve to 10-1 for the 2014 campaign. Alabama had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012 and 11-2 in 2013.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made two new additions to his 2015 staff during the offseason, hiring Tosh Lupoi to coach the outside linebackers and bringing in Mel Tucker to lead the secondary. Lupoi enters a full-time role after serving as an analyst a season ago. He has previous experience as an assistant coach at Washington and Cal, where he coached future first-rounders Danny Shelton, Cameron Jordan and Tyson Alualu. Tucker joins the Crimson Tide staff following a two-year stint as the defensive coordinator of the NFL's Chicago Bears. Tucker also served as defensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2009-12) and Cleveland Browns (2008). He originally linked up with Saban as a graduate assistant at Michigan State in 1997 and stayed in East Lansing for two years.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2015-16 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 40 former players (35 active, five injured reserve, practice squad or currently suspended) earning a spot on an NFL roster this season. The Tide currently has the third-most players on an active NFL roster, with LSU at the top with 38 players just one ahead of second place Miami (Fla.). Alabama leads all colleges in producing offensive linemen, with eight currently spotting NFL rosters.

In the last seven NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 48 players selected, including 17 players in first round, 11 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 179-59-1 (.751) record as a college head coach to date. He has four national championships – three at Alabama – six conference championships and 16 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships. He is the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and has won four titles in his last nine years coaching college football. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the fourth coach in the poll era to win four national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant, John McKay and Leahy).

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise approximately \$5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 15 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ARLINGTON, Texas — The University of Alabama's junior running back Derrick Henry had a career day, rushing 13 times for 147 yards and three touchdowns to lead the No. 3 Crimson Tide past No. 20 Wisconsin 35-17 in the Advocare Classic inside AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas. Henry opened up the game's scoring, breaking off a 37-yard run in the first quarter to put Alabama ahead 7-0. He put up two more scores in the third quarter, including a 56-yard touchdown rush that put him over 100 yards for the night, the sixth time in his career he has eclipsed the century mark in a game.

Senior quarterback Jake Coker, making his debut as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback, was an efficient 15-of-21 for 213 yards and one touchdown to go along with no turnovers. Sophomore Cooper Bateman also saw action in the second half, finishing 7-for-8 with 51 yards. Defensively, Alabama was dominant at the line of scrimmage, holding the Badgers to just 40 yards rushing on 21 attempts, an average of 1.9 yards per rush. Senior linebacker recorded 12 total tackles, including five solo. Additionally, Jonathan Allen had two sacks and the team broke up seven passes on the night.
